What is the Al Alliance

Since June 2018, the European Commission is engaged in an open dialogue with citizens, civil society, business and consumer organisations, trade unions, academia, public authorities and experts, within the framework of its Al Strategy (https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/library/communication-artificial-intelligence-europe). This Strategy aims at making the most of the opportunities offered by Al and at addressing the new challenges that it brings. Starting as an online forum for discussions, the Al Alliance has turned into a vibrant community that during the last years contributed to some of the most important policy initiatives launched in the field of Al.

Promoting Trustworthy Al

The AI Alliance was initially created to steer the work of the <u>High-Level Expert Group on Artificial Intelligence</u> (https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/policies/expert-group-ai) (AI HLEG). After the AI HLEG's mandate closed, the AI Alliance community continues to promote Trustworthy AI by sharing-best-practices (https://futurium.ec.europa.eu/en/european-ai-alliance/best-practices) among the members and by helping developers of AI and other stakeholders to apply key requirements, through the ALTAI tool - a practical Assessment List for Trustworthy AI

Building AI Excellence and Trust in Europe

In February 2020 the Commission published a White Paper

(https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/consultations/white-paper-artificial-intelligence-european-approach-excellence-and-trust) to present its approach for an Ecosystem of Excellence and Trust in Al. The document that was largely inspired by Al HLEG's work, became subject to an open public consultation. Over 1215 contributions

(https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/white-paper-artificial-intelligence-public-consultation-towards-european-approach-ex cellence-and) (including 400 position papers) were received through the online questionnaire and communication channels of the Al Alliance. A series of meetings and round tables with Al experts were organised to enrich this vision with all societal, economic and scientific viewpoints. As a result, the Commission reviewed the Coordinated Plan on Al (https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/policies/plan-ai#:e:text=The%20key%20aims%20of%20the Al%20policy%20to%20the

In parallel, the Commission also proposed a Regulation laying down harmonised rules on Al, that entered into force

The members of the European Al Alliance meet with experts, stakeholders and international actors in the field of Ai, in regular events. Since the launch of the forum, such events brought together in average 500 (in person) to 1000 (virtual) participants on a yearly basis.

"European Excellence and Trust in the world

The events engaged the AI community in discussing aspects of Trustworthy AI, within the contexts of EUs international outreach

(https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/policies/international-outreach-ai) and member-state coordination respectively.

The 4th Al Alliance Assembly

(https://digital-strategy.ec.europa.eu/en/events/4th-european-ai-alliance-assembly-leading-trustworthy-ai-globally) will take place on 16 and 17 November 2023 in Mardid and will focus on policy aspects that are "Leading Trustworthy Al Globally". It will be co-organised by the Commission together with the Spanish Ministry of Economic Affairs and Digital Transformation, in the frame of the Spanish Presidency of the Council of the EU (https://spanish-presidency.consilium.europa.eu/en/) and will be open to the public for in-person and online participation.
